Itinerary:

The city tour above included entrance fee to most important place in Phnom Penh, such as **Royal Place**, built by King Norodom in 1866 on the site of the old town, and the **Silver Pagoda, Raung Damrei Museum**. The Palace building and Silver Pagoda are located with in the same walled ground. The Silver Pagoda is so named because of its floor, which is made up of 5000 silver tiles. The treasures include a solid gold Buddha encrusted and weighing 90 kilos and a small 17th century emerald and baccarat crystal Buddha. And then move to **National Museum of Fine Arts**, next to the Royal Palce was dedicated by king Sisowath in 1920. Over 5000 objects are on display including Angkorian era statues, lingas and other artifacts, most notably the legentary statue of the “Leper King” Though the emphasis is on Angkorian artifacts, there is also a good collection of pieces from later periods, including a special exhibition pf post-Angkorian Buddha figures. Afternoon, we visit **Toul Sleng Museum of Genocide** and **Cheung-Ek Killing Fields**. Then visit **Wat Phnom**, a small hill crowned by an active wat (pagoda) marks the legendary founding place of the Phnom Penh

Itinerary:

The half day city tour focus on the **Royal Place**, built by King Norodom in 1866 on the site of the old town, and the **Silver Pagoda, Raung Damrei Museum**. The Palace building and Silver Pagoda are located with in the same walled ground. The Silver Pagoda is so named because of its floor, which is made up of 5000 silver tiles. The treasures include a solid gold Buddha encrusted and weighing 90 kilos and a small 17th century emerald and baccarat crystal Buddha. Itinerary:

The half day city tour included a visit Notorious **Tuol Sleng Museum**. In 1975 Tuol Svay Prey High School was taken over by Pol Pot's security forces and turned into a prison known as Security Prison 21 (S-21). It soon became the largest such center of detention and torture in the country. More than 17,000 people held at S-21 were taken to the extermination camp at Choeung Ek to be executed; detainees who died during torture were buried in mass graves in the prison ground. The museum displays include room after room of these photographs of men, women and children covering the walls from floor to ceiling; virtually all the people pictured were later killed. Continue to visit **Killing Field** of Cheung Ek is situated 15 kilometers south-west of Phnom Penh and made famous by the film of the same name "Killing Field". it was a place where more than 17,000 civilians were killed and buried in mass graves; many of them transported here after detention and torture in Toul Sleng. This place is a chilling reminder of the brutalities of the genocidal Khmer Rouge regime. In the center of the area is a 17 story glass stupa which houses 8000 skulls exhumed from mass graves. Then **Independence Monument** was inaugurated in November 9, 1962 to celebrate Cambodia's independence from foreign rule. And continue to the **National Garden Park**.

Itinerary:

Visit the **Central Market**, another landmark of the city of Phnom Penh. Or the **Russian Market** (Psah Tuol Thom Pong), an outdoor market where you will find antiquities, silver and gold jewelry, gems, silk, kramas, stone and wood carvings, as well as T-Shirts, CDs and other souvenirs. **Late afternoon will enjoy Sunset Cruise on the Mekong River**. Short river cruises and sunset cruises along the Phnom Penh riverfront are easy to arrange and offer a view of the city. A tour cruise typically takes about 1 hours and runs up the Tonle Sap River along the central riverfront area providing a picturesque view of the Royal Palace, National Museum, parks and Phnom Penh skyline, and then across the Tonle Sap and up the Mekong River to view floating fishing villages. Best lighting in the early morning as the low eastern sun illuminates the front of the Royal Palace and riverfront area.) Longer cruises are also possible and can be tailored to your requirements - upriver tours to villages and paddies, dinner and party cruises, sunset cruises, trips to Silk Island and Mekong Island.

Morning after breakfast, take boat trip to visit **MUSLIM** and **VIETNAMESE FLOATING VILLAGE** at Chroy Changva, is a quiet Muslim community living in a fishing village on the land which lies between the “**Tonle Sap**” and “**Mekong River**” before they fuse. You will experience the daily fishing life of **CHAM living** on floating house, praying on floating **MOSQUE**. These are poor families. We continue boat trip from **CHAM VILLAGE** to Phnom Penh, from there we also take short stop visit Vietnamese floating village which next to **CHAM** village to experience their daily life. back by boat to Phnom Penh.
